- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom

## Teachers, Parents, Students – Together for Success

### In The Classroom

Our 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Team will work with students to develop understanding and mastery of all presented subject matter. Together with students we will set goals to be achieved throughout the year.

- We will communicate expectations between home and school.
- Develop Strategies to foster the reading process.
- Create numeracy activities that give students opportunities to gain true understanding of values and quantities of numbers.
- Students will have the opportunity each day to write and develop vocabulary to compose writing pieces.
- Teachers will provide real life application and hands-on learning opportunities each day.

### At Home

Together Tradewind parents and staff can keep student success and morale high with positive communication between home and school. Together we can make your student successful.

- Use daily folders to communicate questions or concerns and show how learning goals are met through trackers. It will also be used for behavior.
- As a parent, you can help by reading with your child everyday and talk about how the story connects with personal experiences. Ex. I saw this when..., this made me feel..., this book reminds me of the book \_\_\_\_\_ because. You may also ask your student what are the characters, setting, problem and solution.
- As a parent you can help connect math concepts to the real world by asking questions such as: today we passed 3 stoplights on the way to school, how many different colored lights did we pass in all. You may also have them make purchases and count out change.

### Students

Tradewind Elementary students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. We thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Together throughout the year students, parents and staff will work with our students to create and achieve goals that will improve behavior and performance. By implementing and daily use these goals can help show the importance of learning at home and school. When students take responsibility for their learning success in all subject areas in inevitable.
- Set goals to read a book or chapter each day.
- Take time to ask questions about unfamiliar words.
- Use new vocabulary on a daily basis.
- Take responsibility at home such as making grocery list and estimating how much the food will cost.
- Take time to keep a journal and write about daily experiences. If you can say it, you can write it!
